Details of the school's reading schemes used in KS1

Children in Key Stage 1 follow *Read Write inc. phonics* for their teaching of reading. To support children in their reading development, and in order to keep expectations in line with what stage they are actually at in their reading, children choose (per week) 2 decodable readers (see list below); the expectation is that they read these books <u>to</u>an adult, with fluency. These children are also given a 'challenging reader', the expectation here is to read this book <u>with</u> an adult, being supported and encouraged as they do so.

The following schemes are in school for children to choose their decodable reader from:

- RWI phonics
- Oxford: 'Read with Biff and Chipper'
- Pearson: 'Phonics Bug'
- ORT phonics
- Ruth Miskin's Super Phonics

The children choose their challenging reader from:

- a range of general class fiction (categorised into abilities)
- Story World
- Tree Tops
- ORT

Those children who have already completed *Read Write inc. phonics* choose their weekly reading books from the following sources:

General class fiction (categorised into abilities)

ORT

Treetops

Storyworld
