Things to do at home:

Go to the library and look for non-fiction books about mini beasts. Search on the internet. Go on a bug hunt and count how many you can find. If your child is moving up to Reception or is at the stage where they are interested in mark making and writing, please encourage them to write their name, make lists and labels or even write a little message to another family member or friend, for example a reminder to Mum to bring their 'sun hat' to nursery. This could then be stuck on the front door. This will help your child to understand that writing has a purpose. We would love to see photos of anything you do at home on 2simple.

Please help:

Please apply sun cream to your child and send them in with a sun hat and fresh water bottle each day. This hot weather is lovely but can be dangerous if your child isn't protected.
