Things to do at home:

Go on a 'Snail Search', while you are out and about have a look in dark, damp places, under stones and logs, and see if you can find any snails! Have a close look at them with your child. (You might even get to like them!!)

If you happen to know about any snails that would like to visit nursery we would make them very welcome!! Please bring in some of the leaves they were eating where you found them.
