This half term's theme is 'All about me'

Our overarching topic this half term is 'All about me'. This week we are looking at 'Me and Emotions'. We are also continuing to incorporate the whole school topic of 'Islands' into our work. To link the two, we are thinking about how we would feel if we were on a desert island. We will be exploring different emotions, making Mood Monsters in the playdough to help our physical development as well as our creativity. We will also be finishing our Island display, which the children will be painting and making items to go on the island, as well as making pirates with paper plates and lots of exciting materials. The children will be looking at matching numbers to numerals and naming and drawing 2D shapes. The children will all get a chance to do some baking this week too, making crispy cakes which we will turn into pirate ships!
