This half term's theme is 'All about me'

Our overarching topic this half term is 'All about me'. This week we are starting look at Harvest. We are going to do some harvest food tasting, talking about our likes and dislikes, as well discussing colour, texture and how food changes when it is cooked. If your child has an allergy which you have not yet informed us about, please contact a member of Nursery staff so we are aware of it. We are also going to make vegetable people this week and look at ways our food is harvested. We shall also be practicing our songs for the Harvest festival next week, so you may hear the children singing these at home!

Another theme we are looking at this week is kindness. We are hoping to emphasise the importance of being kind, sharing and being nice to each other. We are hoping after our discussions we will gather all of the children's ideas and create a 'Kindness Tree' with them all displayed for parents to see.

Please can you make sure that all items of clothing are labelled with the children's name. We already have some cardigans that have been left behind with no names on. We are beginning to practice songs that we will be singing in our Harvest Festival. We would like to invite parents in to school to see our performance in the festival, which will be held on Thursday 11th October at about 9.15am.
